

Praying Daily For Your Husband

(adapted from "Making a Difference In Ministry" by Betty Morgan)

"Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it, with an attitude of thanksgiving."

Colossians 4:2

Sunday

1. That he would be Biblical and faithful in public and private worship, delighting more and more in God and his Word. (Psalm 1:2; 37:4; 119:24, 77, 92, 143; Proverbs 23:26; Song of Solomon 2:3)
2. That he might become a holy man, a humble man of prayer, mature in the Lord, ever growing in his knowledge of God. (1 Thess 5:23; Colossians 4:12; Ephesians 6:18; 3:16-19; 2 Peter 3:18)

Monday

3. That he might learn~ and be enabled to take every thought captive, to be not conformed to the world's thinking but to think Scripturally. (Romans 12:1-2; 2 Corinthians 10:5)
4. That he would learn to not depend upon his circumstances, people, or things for happiness and fulfillment, but upon God alone; that he would consistently feed upon God's Word for the nourishment of his own soul. (1 Habbakuk 3:17—19; Jeremiah 15:16)

Tuesday

5. That he ought daily seek God with all his heart, walking in time Spirit moment by moment in a manner worthy of the Lord, growing in his trust in and dependence on Him. (Psalm 63:1 -2; 119:1-2; 27:4; Proverbs 3:56, John 15:5)
6. That his sense of significance and self-image would be a reflection of the Lord's thoughts toward him. (Ephesians 1:17-18; Romans 12:3; Psalm 139)
7. That he might have new, increased strength in the midst of his busy schedule; that the Lord would infuse him with His strength to labor faithfully in his appointed place of service. (Isaiah 40:31; Ephesians 3:14-19; Philippians 4:13)

Wednesday

8. That God would enable him to be faithful and fruitful by precept and example, for the building and strengthening of God's Kingdom. (1 Timothy 4:11— 12; Ephesians 5:1 -2)
9. That he might learn to love God and others in a Biblical way. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7; Romans 12:8 -10); Acts 20-28)

Thursday

10. That he might demonstrate reverence and gratitude, not driven, with well-thought-through and prayed-through goals in life. (1 Corinthians 9:19-27)
11. That the Lord would give him wisdom to lead his family physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually; that he would lovingly give teaching, exhortation, encouragement, and discipline as needed. (Ephesians 1:17-19; 6:4; 5:25-31; 1 Thess.2:11-12; James 1 :5-7)
12. That the fruit of the Spirit might be exhibited more and more in his life. (Galatians 5:22-23)

Friday

13. That he might stand firm against the schemes of the devil, recognizing and resisting Satan in all circumstances (Ephesians 6:10- 18; James 4:7; 2 Corinthians 2: 11; 1 Peter 5:8)
14. That he might not be deceived into unbelief or sin in any form; that he would be uncompromising with the world, the flesh or the devil. (Matthew 26:58-75; Galatians 6:7; Ephesians 5:1 1)
15. That he would be continually faithful to examine himself in light of Scripture; recognizing, confessing, and repenting of all inward and outward sins. (Psalm 119:130; 32:1 -5; 51:10; 1 John 1:7)

Saturday

16. That the Lord would protect him, guarding his course; that he would have needful grace to accept all "disappointments" as God's sovereign appointments, submitting cheerfully and trustfully to the Lordship of Christ in his life. (Proverbs 2:8; 2 Thess 3:3; Proverbs 19:21; Psalm 135:6; Ephesians 1:11; Daniel 4:35)
17. That he might be self-disciplined, learning to manage his time well. (Ephesians 5:15: Philippians 2:12- 13)
18. That God would give him favor with others outside the walls of your house, opening doors of opportunity for him to have a godly influence in the church and community. (Psalm 133:1-3; Proverbs 21:1; Nehemiah 1:11; 2:18, 20)
