

Praying Daily For Your Wife

"Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it, with an attitude of thanksgiving."

Colossians 4:2

Sunday

1. That she would be Biblical and faithful in public and private worship, delighting more and more in God and His Word. (Psalm 1:2; 37:4; 119:24, 77, 92, 143; Proverbs 23:26; Song of Solomon 2:3)
2. That she might become a holy woman, a humble woman of prayer, mature in the Lord, ever growing in her knowledge of God. (I Thess 5:23; Colossians 4:12; Ephesians 6:18; 3:16-19; II Peter 3:18)

Monday

3. That she might learn and be enabled to take every thought captive, to not be conformed to the world's thinking, but to think Scripturally. (Romans 12:1-2; II Corinthians 10:5)
4. That she would learn to not depend upon her circumstances, people, or things for happiness and fulfillment, but upon God alone; that she would consistently feed upon God's Word for the nourishment of her own soul. (Habbakuk 3:17-19; Jeremiah 15:16)

Tuesday

5. That she ought daily seek God with all her heart, walking in the Spirit moment by moment in a manner worthy of the Lord, growing in her trust and dependence on Him. (Psalm 63:1 -2; 119:1-2; 27:4; Proverbs 3:56, John 15:5)
6. That her sense of significance and self-image would be a reflection of the Lord's thoughts toward her. (Ephesians 1:17-18; Romans 12:3; Psalm 139)
7. That she might have new, increased strength in the midst of her busy schedule; that the Lord would infuse her with His strength to labor faithfully in her appointed place of service. (Isaiah 40:31; Ephesians 3:14-19; Philippians 4:13)

Wednesday

8. That God would enable her to be faithful and fruitful by precept and example, for the building and strengthening of God's Kingdom. (I Timothy 4:11-12; Ephesians 5:1-2)
9. That she might learn to love God and others in a Biblical way. (I Corinthians 13:4-7; Romans 12:8-10; Acts 20-28)

Thursday

10. That she might demonstrate reverence and gratitude, not driven, with well thought-through and prayed-through goals in life. (I Corinthians 9:19-27)
11. That the Lord would give her wisdom to love her family physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually; That she would lovingly give teaching, exhortation, encouragement, and discipline as needed. (Ephesians 1:17-19; 6:4; 5:25-31; I Thess. 2:11-12; James 1:5-7)
12. That the fruit of the Spirit might be exhibited more and more in her life. (Galatians 5:22-23)

Friday

13. That she might stand firm against the schemes of the devil, recognizing and resisting Satan in all circumstances (Ephesians 6:10-18; James 4:7; II Corinthians 2:11; I Peter 5:8)
14. That she might not be deceived into unbelief or sin in any form; that she would be uncompromising with the world, the flesh or the devil. (Matthew 26:58-75; Galatians 6:7; Ephesians 5:11)
15. That she would be continually faithful to examine herself in light of Scripture; recognizing, confessing, and repenting of all inward and outward sins. (Psalm 119:130; 32:1-5; 51:10; I John 1:7)

Saturday

16. That the Lord would protect her, guarding her course; That she would have needful grace to accept all "disappointments" as God's sovereign appointments, submitting cheerfully and trustfully to the Lordship of Christ in her life. (Proverbs 2:8; II Thess. 3:3; Proverbs 19:21; Psalm 135:6; Ephesians 1:11; Daniel 4:35)
17. That she might be self-disciplined, learning to manage her time well. (Ephesians 5:15; Philippians 2:12-13)
18. That God would give her favor with others outside the walls of your house, opening doors of opportunity for her to have a godly influence in the church and community. (Psalm 133:1-3; Proverbs 21:1; Nehemiah 1:11; 2:18, 20)
